Lee Road Revitalization Updates

Walmart Neighborhood Market - 2 November, the Grand Opening had a large turnout of shoppers, store staff, and county officials who spoke about the new store and welcoming their new community neighbors. Donation check posters were presented to representatives from neighborhood nonprofit organizations. Edgewater High School color guards raised the US flag and the band provided music for the audience.

Lee Road Shopping Center – Aagaard-Juergensen is currently remodeling the complete facade around the front of the shopping center to have similar architecture as the recently opened Walmart Neighborhood Market. This remodel project includes all new sidewalks and landscaping in a freshly resurfaced parking lot.



Community Meeting Highlights - 11 October 2016

Orange County Office of Emergency Management - Presentation

Carlos Durden discussed the severity of different Florida storms including hurricanes (including Matthew which hit 7 October), tornadoes, and lightning. This was a very interactive presentation with audience questions and answers. Carlos went over many preparation topics, from the county's perspective, to setup shelters based on actual storm directions and severity. He also discussed having personal belongings and important documents available should evacuation be declared. It is very important for people with special needs to be registered in advance so the county can make sure they are contacted during any emergency situation.

National Night Out 2017

Ben Shaddrick, National Night Out (NNO) Chairperson, informed the audience he attended the Pine Castle NNO on 4 October. They had two grills to cook and serve food, several vendor booths setup, and about 30 middle school kids who attended with their parents and kids wore the same shirts. The organizers had clearly visible signs advertising the event at the YMCA from the road. Ben said he is looking for volunteers to help with next year's event. David showed the details of their website and said they offer Android and Apple mobile device support with the apps having the same information as the website. There are several interactive maps that help show what work is happening in that area and drawings of the plans. This also includes Lee Road interchange for the details. Commuters can customize notifications to pin-point specific areas to receive messages about the conditions or upcoming changes. This is the first time in the country that this feature has been deployed.


