FRIDAY BEFORE CLEAN-UP DAY

1. Clean up your yard, pick up any litter, and place unwanted bulky items curbside including furniture, mattresses, appliances, etc. **WE WILL NOT PICK-UP YARD WASTE, REFRIGERATORS OR AIR CONDITIONERS.**
2. If disabled or a senior citizen, call 407-836-1660 to make an appointment to have your household hazardous waste picked up on Clean-Up Day.

1. Join your neighbors in cleaning common areas in your neighborhood. To volunteer, meet us at Christ the King Episcopal Church at 8:00 AM. Light refreshments will be served and all volunteers will receive **FREE** T-shirts, gloves, and trash bags.
2. Orange County crews will pick up unwanted bulky items at curbside between 8:00 and 11:00 AM.
 - **Household hazardous waste and unwanted bulky items** will be picked up at your house between 8:00 and 11:00 AM (hazardous waste by appointment **ONLY** for disabled and senior citizens).
 - **AFTER 11:00 AM RESIDENTS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR REMOVAL OF ANY ITEMS OR TRASH LEFT CURBSIDE AFTER THE CLEAN-UP.**

Why is it important to be counted in the census?

By law, the U.S. government is required by the Constitution to count each person living in the United States and its territories every 10 years. This once-a-decade census data helps businesses, researchers, and communities make decisions, provide daily services, products, and support for you and your neighbors. The 2020 population numbers will also shape how political power and federal tax dollars are distributed over the next 10 years.

Do I have to fill out the census?

Participating in the census is required by law, even if you are not a United States citizen.

Will my information be safe?

Your answers can only be used to produce statistics—they cannot be used against you in any way, by any government agency. By law, all responses to U.S. Census Bureau surveys are kept completely confidential, even from law enforcement agencies. In fact, every employee takes an oath to protect your personal information for life.

¿Por qué es importante ser contado en el censo?

Por ley, la Constitución exige que el gobierno de los Estados Unidos cuente a cada persona que viven en los Estados Unidos y sus territorios cada 10 años. Estos datos del censo ayudan a las empresas y las comunidades a tomar decisiones, proporcionar servicios diarios, productos y apoyo para usted y sus vecinos. Las cifras de población de 2020 también determinarán cómo se distribuirán el poder político y los dólares de los impuestos federales en los próximos 10 años.

¿Tengo que completar el censo?

La ley exige participar en el censo, incluso si usted no es ciudadano de los Estados Unidos.

¿Estará segura mi información?

Sus respuestas solo se pueden usar para generar estadísticas - ninguna agencia gubernamental puede usarlas en su contra de ninguna manera. Por ley, todas las respuestas a las encuestas en la Oficina del Censo de los Estados Unidos se mantienen completamente confidenciales, incluso de las agencias de aplicación de la ley. De hecho, cada empleado hace un juramento para proteger su información personal de por vida.
