The federal law, through the U.S. Constitution and the Supreme Court, protects personal data for the Census. It only takes a few minutes to complete.

Why is it important to be counted in the census?

By law, the U.S. government is required by the Constitution to count each person living in the United States and its territories every 10 years. This once-adecade census data helps businesses, researchers, and communities make decisions, provide daily services, products, and support for you and your neighbors. The 2020 population numbers will also shape how political power and federal tax dollars are distributed over the next 10 years.

Do I have to fill out the census?

Participating in the census is required by law, even if you are not a United States citizen.

Will my information be safe?

Your answers can only be used to produce statisticsthey cannot be used against you in any way, by any government agency. By law, all responses to U.S. Census Bureau surveys are kept completely confidential, even from law enforcement agencies. In fact, every employee takes an oath to protect your personal information for life.

Por ley, todas las respuestas a las encuestas en la Oficina del Censo de los Estados Unidos se mantienen completamente confidenciales, incluso de las agencias de aplicación de la ley. De hecho, cada empleado hace un juramento para proteger su información personal de por vida.


