Lee Road Safe Neighborhoods has been busy these past few months. In December we did our annual toy distribution for the children living in the extended-stay hotels along Lee Road. Presents were distributed on December 20 to two hotels along with homemade cookies. The wraps are anti-graffiti and should hold up for many years. The artists include Stef Mates, Janet Asbury, Norman Andersen, Chelsey Vowles, John Carollo, Katrina Snyder, and Delaney Bolstein. You can see the boxes along Lee Road (at Edgewater, Kingswood, Adanson, Diplomat, and I-4), Fairbanks Avenue (at Edgewater and Adanson) and Edgewater Drive (at Fairbanks and Forest City). Orange County Sheriff's Office Tips

PRACTICE THESE WALKER/JOGGER TIPS:

- Be aware of your surroundings at all times – listening to loud music in your headphones limits your ability to hear an offender.
- Jog or walk in a well-lit, well-traveled familiar area - Wearing bright colored or reflective clothes improves your visibility.
- Run or walk in groups – There's always safety in numbers.
- Theft is a crime of opportunity, when going to the gym, don't leave valuables visible in your car – placing them in your trunk makes your vehicle less desirable for burglars.
- Once inside the gym, store your phone and keys in a gym locker with a lock, or wear a fanny pack and keep them with you at all times.
